

Calibrating Cabochons for Non-standard Bezels

I recently completed a custom order for some aquamarine cabochons to replace stones in a beautiful silver necklace for a jeweler. The jeweler was about 130 miles from me so he sent digital caliper photos to use for the stones. Calibrated stones can usually be ordered or cut with regular templates. None of these were the same size and none were calibrated sizes. caliper measurements The also included the bezels so the stones would have to be reduced in size for the bezel thickness.

Attached are some photos of the process, before and after photos. Since I had two different colors of aquamarine, I cut two sets and his client could choose which they preferred.


As silversmiths we usually cut the stone and then make the bezel to fit, so it doesn't matter if it is not exactly to standard.

A challenge for you who do Lapidary - When cutting some cabs, try to cut a few to a predetermined size. This skill will allow you to cut stones for repairs on broken jewelry for yourself or your friends.



Glass Activity

Since this is a rock and glass club I wanted to mention that there are a couple of ways to integrate rocks into your stained glass project. Using polished slabs is the most straightforward. As long as the slab is roughly the same thickness as a standard piece of glass you can treat it as a normal piece of glass by using copper foil or lead. If your rock is too thick, you can grind on side flat and glue the stone to a

larger piece of glass. The also works well with small tumbled rock chips to create a mini glass on glass mosaic within a larger project. When soldering the joints, be mindful of the rocks' placement to ensure they are firmly held without disrupting the integrity of the glasswork. The rocks can be used to highlight specific areas, add texture, or introduce natural colors and patterns, creating a dynamic interplay between the glass and the stone. Felice
