



SITE INFO/DETAILS:	We will be roadside hunting. The coral is collected from the surface. No digging is			
	required. This hunt will not take more than 1-2 hours. This spot is only a few steps from			
	the car. This hunt is very easy.			
WHAT TO BRING/WEAR:	Participants should supply all rockhounding and essential gear. Durable clothing such as jeans and hiking boots are suggested. There is always a possibility of encountering snakes, so be sure to keep children close to the hunt area and it would be best if they wore high top boots of some kind. Insect repellent is also recommended. Bring a hat for sun/rain protection and also a raincoat or poncho just in case. Be sure to bring buckets or boxes to carry your treasures home. Be sure to bring plenty of water.
